Tim Murray, MD, MBA, arguably the most active academic vitreoretinal surgeon in this country, is recognized internationally for his excellence in clinical care, research, and teaching. Since completing his vitreoretinal training at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Dr. Murray has been on faculty at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in Miami, Florida, where he is a Professor of Ophthalmology with a joint appointment in Radiation Oncology. He has a high volume vitreoretinal practice, directs the ocular oncology service at Bascom Palmer, and is a driving force behind one of the country's finest vitreoretinal fellowship training programs. Dr. Murray is a prolific writer whose expansive breadth of expertise has led to 180 articles in peer-reviewed journals on topics as diverse as gene transfer for treatment of uveal melanoma to management of anterior segment complications following phacoemulsification. He maintains an R01-funded research laboratory that is expanding our treatments for life-threatening neoplasms such as retinoblastoma and uveal melanoma, and he has been actively involved in the administrative structure of Bascom Palmer.

Purpose: The series of clinical conferences sponsored by the Department of Ophthalmology presents updated information on a broad spectrum of clinical issues and approaches that are of value and interest to the practicing ophthalmologist.

Objectives: Upon completion of this conference, participants should have gained an appreciation for and knowledge of:
